Dear Mosaïek family,

As we pause to reflect on the year behind us and look ahead to what God is doing among us, my heart is filled with gratitude. Gratitude for people, for stories, and for the quiet, faithful ways love continues to show up in our community.

We sense that we are standing at a pivotal moment in time. Perhaps even the shift the world is waiting for. If there is a pandemic of our time, it is loneliness. And it is into this reality that God continues to call us. Scripture reminds us that love is not optional. Paul writes, "If I have a faith that can move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing" (1 Corinthians 13:2). Without love, there is nothing. Love is not an add-on to our faith; it is at the very heart of it. We are asking God to help us love others well, because when we belong, we can become who God created us to be.

God is inviting us to pay attention, to notice what He is stirring, and to respond with courage. Jesus reminds us that transformation begins in the heart. In Mark 7, He says that what truly shapes our lives flows from within. As our hearts are formed in the likeness of Christ, our lives begin to reflect Him for the sake of others.

Each of us is invited to know Him, follow Him, and love Him. Yet we are all at different phases of that journey. Some are discovering faith for the first time. Some are finding their way back. Others are learning how to live out this faith more fully in the ordinary moments of work, family, loss, and joy. Wherever you find yourself, you are welcome here. As we move into this next season, we will be giving our attention to five key areas:

- A with-God life, where our formation begins in intimacy with Him.
- The formation of our youth, including a new journey called TYO (The Young Ones), a year of discernment after Matric.
- Familia, walking with families through every phase and season of life.
- Community life, where relationships are nurtured and deepened.
- MosaicPM, our Sunday evening service, that will be experiential and worship-oriented.

At the heart of all of this is a simple but profound calling: to be formed in the way of Christ for the sake of others. To become people who hold space with love and compassion. People who discover their calling in relationship. People who choose love, again and again.

So I want to leave us with this question:

Who are you becoming as you live this one wild and precious life gifted to you? My prayer is that we would listen closely, take a brave step toward community, and join hands to become a people known by love.

# DEEPER

## Growing in Awareness of God

Our journey as a community begins with a deeper awareness of God: Who He is, where He is present, and how we are invited into a growing, honest relationship with Him. In 2025, we intentionally journeyed deeper in our with-God life. Through in-person and online services, we created space to encounter God together in worship, Scripture, silence, and prayer. We were reminded that formation does not happen in a moment, but over time, as we return again and again to God's presence. Beyond our Sunday gatherings, many in our community participated in the daily formation journey, retreats and praxis. These practices helped us move from simply knowing about God to becoming more attentive to His presence in our everyday lives. This year affirmed a simple truth: when we slow down, listen, and make space for God, our hearts begin to change. Duane Lohrentz took a step in deepening his faith journey by going on his very first retreat at Origins. He shares how this experience was for him.

"I wasn't really sure what to expect, as I had never been on a retreat before. It was a truly unbelievable experience that I will never forget. This retreat was designed to give you time and space, silence and stillness with the Lord that we often don't get in our everyday lives, with work and perhaps children or other dependants filling our days. At Origins, there are various places where you can spend time with God, where you can sit in prayer. All of these spaces help you take your mind off the hustle and bustle of everyday life and focus on hearing from God. It is something you don't necessarily get to experience anywhere else. I experienced the Lord in a different way than I ever have before.

It was personal and very special. I feel rested and rejuvenated.

I really encourage you to come and experience it for yourself."

## Living Out Our Faith Beyond Ourselves

The world is broken in many ways. To love meaningfully, we are called to move beyond our comfortable boundaries and journey further into the world around us.

Part of our journey as a community is a daily commitment to identify with the needs of the world and to never forget the poor. Love, when practiced, always leads us outward. It calls us to notice suffering, to stand with those on the margins, and to respond with compassion and faithfulness.

Through our F.A.C.T kitchens, Missio ministry, and various outreach partnerships, we continued to serve and support projects that reflect God’s heart for justice, dignity, and care. This work reminds us that formation is never only for our own growth. We are being shaped in the likeness of Christ for the sake of others. Megan, a Missio co-worker who has volunteered at the Florida Baby Home since 2018, gives us a glimpse of the lasting impact of serving.

“There has always been a longing in my heart to give back, and I have always enjoyed working with children. Many people feel unsure if they can volunteer because they fear it will be too sad. But I believe one should come with an open heart and give love and time. Giving and serving has helped me grow in how I think about others and about my own relationships. It invites us to live beyond ourselves and our immediate families. It teaches vulnerability and generosity. I believe this is the Lord’s hand at work in the lives of these children.

Despite the difficult circumstances they come from, they are blessed to have a safe haven. The Lord is so good, and there are countless small blessings here. My journey at the Baby Home has opened my heart to see how great God is. Being a small part of these children’s stories awakens deep gratitude in me. I am grateful that I can give and serve the Lord. In this space, I am His hands and His feet.”

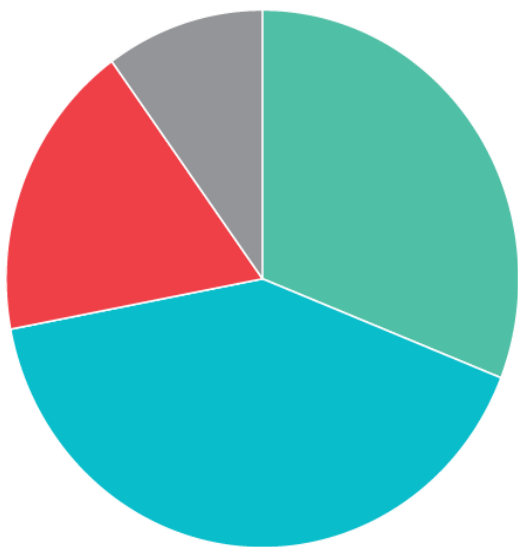
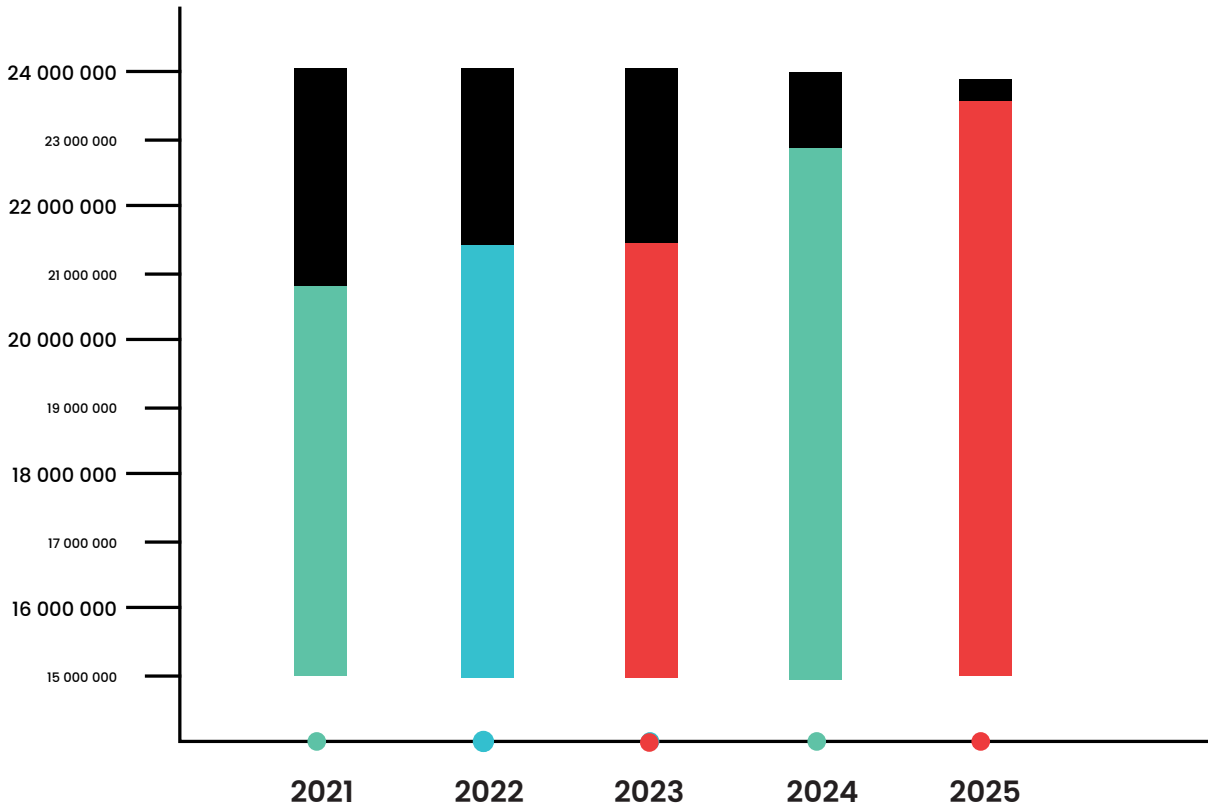

## OPERATING INCOME

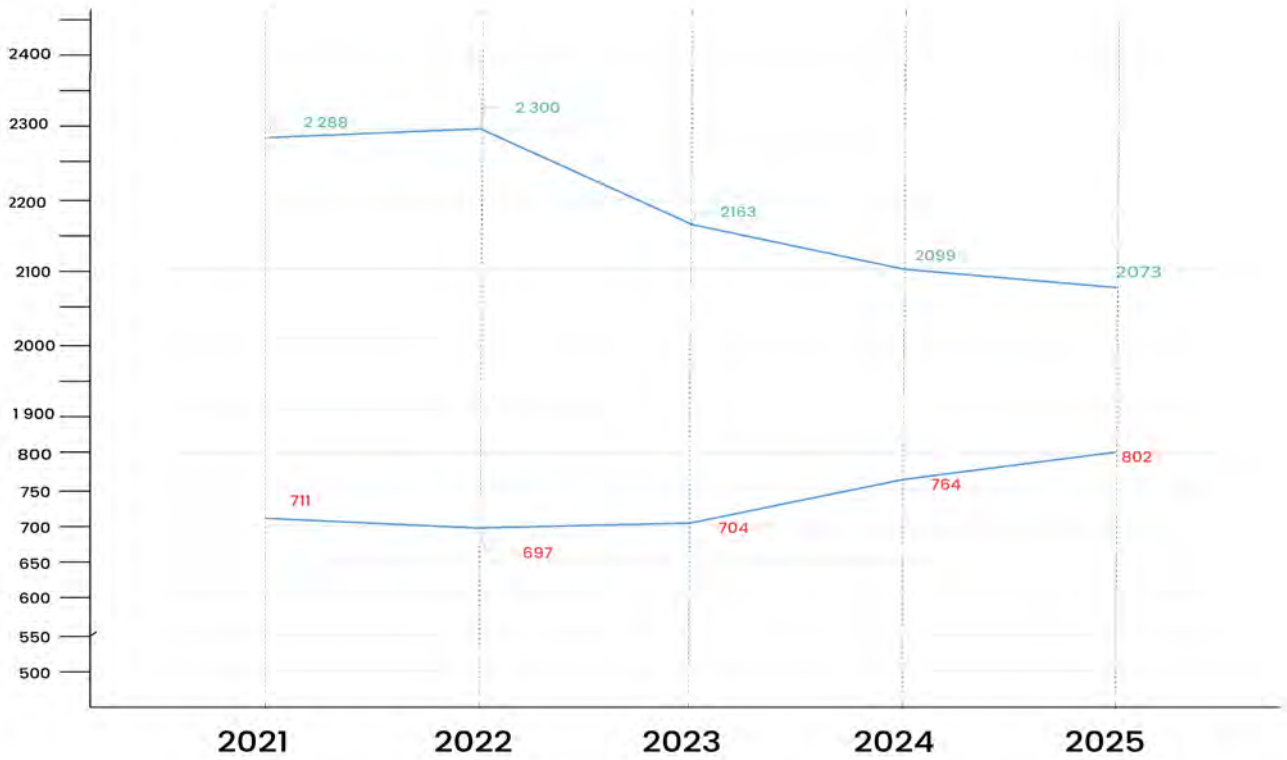


## ALLOCATION OF EXPENSES
